

Town of Indian Lake water and wastewater Report for July 2024

Testing was completed daily at all three plants.

DEC and DOH monthly samples were submitted to the lab as well as our annual PFOS samples for both districts.

The DOH came and did their annual inspections of both water plants, water storage tanks and flow control valves.

The Indian Lake plants had very little problems during the power outage. The Abanakee Dam also worked good with a generator. We had to open and close the dam for rafting and to keep the lake at a good level.

We repaired a leak at the end of the line on Cedar River Rd.

We had to jett out a sewer service .

The drying bed was shoveled off.

The communication system is still not working between the water plant and the tanks up on tower hill. We are exploring what our options are so these problems don't happen again.

Mow and weedeat at the sewer plant as needed.

Monthly report July 2024 Building maintenance and operations

Beach season started in July and all the beaches are ready to go and have been running fairly well. The first four days of July we had a few hiccups with scheduling and letting people know which beaches were open on which days. We had our yearly health inspection and both beaches passed with a couple small violations for signage. Both lifeguards deserve a lot of credit this year, two incident reports for swimmers in distress and they handled it just like they were trained.

At the Cedar River cemetery we poured five concrete foundations for stones, set two stones and made some repairs to some of the graveside markers that had moved or tipped over, stood up and repaired a few headstones.

We painted all the picnic tables in Byron Park, they were taken to the middle of town and set up for Fourth of July fireworks and a band. Put up the large town tent and took down after event was over, we left the stage to be used for future events.

We moved all our picnic tables to Axes and Irons for a family fun day and when the event was over we cleaned up and returned all the tables to town center.

During the big power outage we assisted with cleanup on some of the town roads and in Moose River Plains, in Blue Mountain Lake we had to redo the cemetery road and haul material to the Blue Mountain beach to fill in washouts along the road and by the canoe launch. Four trips were made by my guys to Lake Pleasant for dry ice, supervisor Wells and myself did the last trip over for our final 10 bags. filled both fuel tanks on both trucks and kept all of our town generators full.

We mowed all town properties twice this month including the shooting range, transfer station and all cemeteries. Mowers were serviced as needed, deck belts were replaced on the Husqvarna zero turn, and a steering link replaced on the Husqvarna at the transfer site.

Spent a lot of time working in the air-conditioning units at the library, after talking with a tech from Bj Queen he explained that our units are almost at the end of their life cycle and we should think about upgrading. We serviced all the units correctly and he said we did a fantastic job so all he had to do was add Freon.

Most weeks I have lost two guys to the highway to help with their projects, being they have rental equipment we are trying to get the most out of it and everyone has been working very well together.

Community/Economic Development

Indian Lake Museum - A special meeting was held on July 24 where Supervisor Wells shared the Pierce Family has graciously offered to gift the Lake Store in Sabael to the Town so we may rehouse the Town of Indian Lake Museum's historic collection. At this meeting Supervisor Wells suggested the board members should visit both the current museum (which is in serious need of repair and cannot be open to the public because it is unsafe) and The Lake Store. Moving the collection to The Lake Store would provide the Town with a safe place to exhibit and expand its collection, pay homage to Sabael's unique history, and provide a welcoming gateway by connecting this hamlet to the town center among a myriad of other possibilities. More information should follow at the next board meeting.

ILCDC's SIB (Sabael, Indian Lake, Blue Mountain Lake Re-Vibe) Committee – The ILCDC will be hosting a reception on Saturday, August 17 from 5 to 7pm at the Pierce Barn in Sabael. The event is free and open to all. They'll also be thanking Brenda and Jack Valentine for their years of community service. The Valentine's will be moving away at the end of the year.

Grants

DASNY/SAM Grants – Letters were sent to Senators Krueger and Ort to seek additional support on July 16. At the time of this report, there has not been any further news.

DEC EV Charging Stations – Just completed the second round of budget edits with NYSDEC. The contract should follow soon. Once I receive the contract, we’ll go out to bid for EV equipment/installation.

Adirondack Park Upper Hudson Rec Grant – This contract has been received and will be returned to the Nature Conservancy 8/8/24.

Reapply for WQIP – A grant for \$2.5M for Lake Adirondack Dam was sent in on 7/24/24. Awards are typically announced around Thanksgiving.

Next grant application to be sent in by end of September will be for an EV car rebate. To qualify we also must provide NYS with a Fleet Inventory, which I am working on currently.

Research has been completed on the Short Term Rental bill which is on the Governor’s desk; battery storage laws and historical societies and possible funding opportunities for the museum.


