A Town board meeting was held on August 11th 2025 at 7:00 p.m. The location of the meeting was the Blue Mt. Fire Hall in the Town of Blue Mountain Lake State of New York, County of Hamilton.

Supervisor Wells called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. All said the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a roll call with the following board members present.

Roll Call:

Councilperson Mahoney: Present Councilperson Eldridge: Present Councilperson Rathbun: Present Councilperson Howard: Present

Supervisor Wells: Present

Approval of minutes:

Supervisor Wells called for a motion for the approval of 7\14\25. Councilperson Mahoney stated there were some spelling corrections to be made. Supervisor Wells accepted the motion with the corrections to be made. Councilperson Eldridge seconded the motion.All were in favor.

Blue Mt. Lake Water Project Presentation:

Attached is the presentation that was done by Suozzo and Doty Engineering.

Department Head Reports:

Councilperson Mahoney asked Eugene Darling Highway Superintendent if he had dates set for the paving projects. Eugene stated August 18th will be John Rust Road and August 19th will be Sawmill Road and Abanakee Road.

Councilperson Howard stated that she Eugene asked for a credit card and she feels he needed one, all were in favor. Councilperson Howard asked Eugene if he was still working on getting a projected cost for the shed. Eugene answered yes. Councilperson Howard asked Christine Pouch what the request for \$26,340.00 from black fly challenge. Christine answered it was for its run by the Inlet Area Business Association, the money that the raise from the black fly race is given out to the communities. Christine requested that for the last trail to be completed at the Ski Hill, there are 3 trails on the ski hill, school adjacent property. We are getting ready to put signage up to open them up to the public. We will likely not get the whole \$26,000.00. Christine Pouch wanted to share that we will be receiving a \$5,000.00 grant through the State Community Regrant fund that is administered by ALCA. We thank ALCA and the Regrant program for rewarding us with that amount. Councilperson Howard asked if they money was for the music programs. Christine stated yes.

Public Comments:

Sean Curry wanted to thank the Parks and Recreation department for keeping up everything in town and to the lifeguards for making this summer very enjoyable. Kathleen Collins from the Blue Mt. Lake Association wanted to thank Brian for coming to their meeting last week and for addressing the many concerns we had. Supervisor Wells thanked them for the invitation, it was a very good meeting, and people would be amazed at what your group does. Belinda Block wanted to thank the Town for the woodchip pile that was out on Durant Road for the gardeners to pull from. Reed Curry wanted to share her

concerns regarding Geroge Virgil, a board member for the Zoning Board of Appeals. Reed feels his statements and actions have been demonstrated a departure from the normal standard of which the ZBA is supposed to do. Reed stated George said the ZBA's job is to give the applicant what they want. Reed stated that when her family raised actual concerns over her family's rental business. George dismissed these concerns while we may lose long-term customers, other new customers would take their place eventually. Reed also stated that at the final meeting when she requested additional time to review additional information that was submitted that same day, George took offence at her request for my additional review time, also that I was insinuating Geroge didn't know how to read. Reed stated that these actions have raised serious concerns about our Zoning review process. Attached is a letter that the Curry family handed out at the meeting to board members. Supervisor Wells stated that the board has no authority over the Zoning board. There however is a process for membership removal. Supervisor Wells stated Taylor will get you the new complaint form.

Budget Schedule Draft:

Supervisor Wells addressed the board with the Budget Schedule draft and asked if anyone had any conflicts with any of the dates. Councilperson Rathbun stated that October 16th he wouldn't be able to make. Supervisor Wells said he would have to look into it because there are certain time frames, we must meet.

D.O.T Resolution #11:

Supervisor Wells stated that we have to pass this resolution for the relocation of the water line on Blue Mountain hill. Supervisor Wells called for a motion; Councilperson Mahoney made the motion. Councilperson Eldridge seconded the motion. All were in favor

Social Media Policy:

Supervisor Wells addressed the board with the draft of the social media policy, he asked board members to review, so we would be able to go over at the September meeting.

Supervisor Comments:

Supervisor Wells addressed the board with the need to decide on fireworks. Councilperson Rathbun stated that he feels that the cost is ridiculous and does not feel like we should be spending our tax dollars this way. Supervisor Wells said that he feels we need to budget at least \$10,000.00, Councilperson Howard agreed with Supervisor Wells. Councilperson Mahoney asked if we would be able to hire the Town of Long Lake to put on a show, since they put their own on. Supervisor Wells said he wasn't sure. Tabled for further discussion. Supervisor Wells stated that the County has a registry now for short-term rental properties. Hamilton County passed Local Law #4 for a registry for animal abusers, this will be done by our Sheriff's department. Also, at the Hamilton County Board of Supervisor's meeting they had a presentation with Lifespan representative they would like to set up a meeting with the Indian Lake Town board. Supervisor Wells stated that he would like to set it up before the budget meetings. All were in favor of this. Supervisor Wells addressed the museum, he thanked Bills crew for moving everything out of the building. Supervisor Wells stated that we are looking to apply for a DEC smart growth grant, but we must approve a resolution for Christine Pouch Economic Development Director to apply for this grant. Councilperson Howard motioned for the approval resolution. Seconded by Councilperson Rathbun. All were in favor. Supervisor Wells stated that he wanted to thank the Lake Pleasant Supervisor Besty Bain and their Highway Superintendant and Bill Laprairie, we were running into a messy situation with our garbage contractor and within a few phone calls they were ready to come over with a truck and help us with our commercial garbage pick-up.

Supervisor Wells motioned to pay the bills and abstracts, seconded by Councilperson Eldridge. All were in favor


Supervisor Wells called for executive session at 8:43 p.m. for the discussion of personnel. Seconded by Councilperson Rathbun.

Proposed Weiss "Camp" on Blue Mountain Lake:

The newest (6/13/25) plans indicate the proposed "CAMP" will include the following:

- A 3,000 SF 1st floor containing a great room facing the lake (1,000 SF +/-), a kitchen, three (3) dishwashers, four (4) kitchen and/or bar sinks, a pantry and nook, dining area, office/den (160 SF), a full bath, an elevator, a laundry and a mechanical room.
- A 3,300 SF second floor with a master bedroom, an office, three (3) additional designated bedrooms, a library (175 SF), four (4) full baths, one half bath, a second laundry, an office and nook space, a "tower" (120 SF), the elevator and an elevated porch adjacent to the main entrance and tower.
- The width and length of new residence is somewhat subjective due to the irregular footprint but reasonable
 estimates of 53 feet wide by 100 feet long appear appropriate. The roof plan indicates the building will
 cover 4,000 SF of area with additional patio spaces and walkways which are not clearly defined on the
 plans.
- The floor plans include rooms designated as office and library spaces which are commonly converted and
 used as additional bedrooms. The great room on the first floor could easily accommodate additional
 guests. Total occupancy could be in the range of fifteen to twenty (15-20) persons.
- The foundation plan illustrates a concrete foundation with a heated, concrete floor on the first floor. The finished floor elevation is about 1-1/2 to 2 feet above existing grade. The bottom of footing would be about 0.5' below the lake level and two feet below the groundwater table. The footing drains are shown slightly above the bottom of footing at or about the lake level.
- The architectural plans illustrate what could be described as a very large residential structure constructed in the "GREAT CAMP" style with stone facades, massive stone fire places, covered and open air elevated porches and a "tower" over the main entrance.

Site Improvements Include:

Sewage System:

The proposed sewage treatment and disposal system consists of a 2,000 gallon septic tank, a sewage pumping station and a raised absorption field with an "Elgen" type absorption trench. Design and construction of this type of system is covered by the NYS Sanitary Code. NYSDOH has confirmed this type of system requires their approval.

No final elevations have been specified for the septic tank and sewage pump station. Preliminary computations indicate the bottom of the septic tank will be three to five feet below the lake level.

Clearing Required:

The site plans indicate the following:

- of the fifty (50) trees identified on the site, twenty-nine (29) or 58% of the trees are scheduled to be cut,
- over one-half of the mature trees (10" or larger in diameter) will be cut, and
- three of the large trees shown to remain are within five (5) feet of the building; construction will lead to the
 premature death of the trees.
