
Community/Economic Development

EV Charging Zoom Panel Presenter for Adirondack Explorer I was invited to participate in this panel presentation to share information re: our Level 3 Fast Chargers on November 13.

ADKAction (our partner with the pollinator project at the landfill) provided 125 Indian Lake Central School families, teachers and others with farm to table food cooler with turkeys or beef from several ADK farms on November 24, 2025. A box of vegetables accompanied every meat delivery. We are very grateful to them for selecting our community. An article was on the front page of the Hamilton County News this past week. The Welcome Center provided the perfect location to stage and fill the coolers. We'd like to thank the school staff and ILCS Board of Directors for distributing these donations.

SHIFT The coalition for North Hamilton County - SHIFT - stands for Supporting Healthy & Informed Futures Together. The main goal is to decrease drug and alcohol use in minors in Hamilton County. The coalition is still taking shape and Kylie is on their committee. The next few meetings will include speakers and training sessions. Next meeting is December 8, 2025.

Charity Hat & Mitten Tree drive this year also included perishable food items. On Wednesday, December 3, we delivered more than 200 pounds of food to Community Action. The drive for all items continues through December 19. Items can be dropped off at the Welcome Center or Town Hall. A



<u>T-Mobile Community Grant</u> I submitted this grant for the fourth trail at the Ski Hut on October 6 asking for \$26,400. Awards will be announced in February 2026. 12/3/25: No new updates.

NYSDEC ADK Smart Growth Grant Round 8 A grant for \$300K was submitted on October 1 to support the Town Museum Rebuild. Awards are due to be announced in December 2025-Janaury 2026. 12/3/25: No new updates.

2025 NYS Budget Appropriation Grant Award for 5 Towns Paperwork was sent in, and we are awaiting a final contract. The funds will support the Town Museum Rebuild. 12/3/25: No new updates.

NYS SWIMS The final report was sent in on October 7. Awaiting \$9,950 to be disbursed. 12/3/25: No new updates.

Northern Forest Adirondack Housing Pre-Development Assistance Program RFP We received a due diligence report and will review it with their team on December 17. More details will follow.

<u>DEC EV Charging Stations</u> Working on close-out paperwork.

<u>DEC Byron Park extension</u> has been approved through July 2026. Final contract has been executed, and project planning/implementation will begin in January.

<u>DEC EV Car Rebate</u> We are waiting for final disbursement. 12/3/25: No new updates.

Monthly Report - November 2025

On November 5th the Highway Dept. returned to our winter work schedule. The crew was busy getting trucks and roads ready for winter. Salt and sand have already been hauled to the garage.

For most of the month we were short-staffed due to vacations and one employee out-of-work with a non-work-related injury. I am still looking for additional employees (F/T and seasonal).

Nov. 3 & 4 (Election Day): storm damage cleanup (trees).

Nov. 11 (Veterans Day): 1st snowfall requiring road clearing.

Truck #183 is back in service. Truck #195 was sent to Mangino Chevrolet for a brake recall repair.

On Nov. 24th truck #185 went off the road while plowing and got stuck in a culvert. This required a winch out from K&K Repairs, Olmstedville. Parks & Rec assisted with traffic control and pulling the truck out. A post-incident inspection revealed no damage to the truck.

CHIPS: Additional claims totaling \$141,881.40 were submitted for reimbursement on all our paving projects this year. \$106,000+ funds carried over to 2026.

Pits: The Town engineers (SDA) are handling the reapplications for Pits #3 and 6. On Nov. 5th they completed a drone flight for updated accurate topography and imagery to be used in preparing the mine plans. The renewals for Pits #1 and 2 are in process internally (due March 5, 2026).

Monthly report Maintenance Department November 2025

Most of our time this month has been spent in the woods, cutting trails, using machinery to reroute snowmobile trails, coverts and general maintenance. We are still working on the half mile reroute on the headquarters trail, logging operations have us moving a lot of trail and doing a lot of cleanup where skidders have gone down our trails.

Recycling has been done every Monday and Friday.

Repair work done on the heat systems in the welcome center, the Library, and the Ski Hut. The boiler at the welcome center had to have a new igniter installed, the other units just needed a good cleaning.

At the Town Hall all the paper towel holders and soap dispensers have been replaced in all three bathrooms, walls have also been resheetrocked and are ready to be painted.

Sheet rock repairs were done at the library, painting done at the library.

Cleaned up the yard at the shop preparing for winter plowing, took care of all outdoor equipment.

Trips are made to TC MURPHY for parts and equipment, trip was made to village motorsports for parts and tools.

Alpine Sprinkler came and did their five year service on the sprinkler system at the Ski Hut. Repairs were made to the dump loader when the tire came off the bead, a plug was installed in the tire to stop foam foam from leaking.

Flags were lowered and raised as needed, and green lightbulbs were installed for veterans memorial week.
