Commercial pick-up for all commercial customers year round, on both Monday and Fridays.
 Recyclable pick-up for Group 1 will be on the first Monday of each month and Group 2 on first Friday
 of each month year round.
 Commercial recyclable pick-up will be once a week for all commercial customers.

Transfer Station hours: Thursday – Monday – 8:30 am – 4:30 pm (closed Tuesday and Wednesdays)
 Blue Mtn. Transfer Station will be open from 8:00 am – 4:30 pm on Saturdays, for construction &
 demolition only. **NO HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE OR RECYCLABLES.**

TRANSFER STATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

PROHIBITED WASTE: THE FOLLOWING WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS GARBAGE AT THE TRANSFER STATION FACILITY:

- Hazardous waste of any kind as identifies in 6 NYCRR Part 360-1.5 (b)
- Waste oils: Including, but not limited to, used engine oil, fuel oil, motor oil, gear oil, cutting oil, transmission fluid, hydraulic fluid, dielectric fluid or oil tank residues (may take as a recyclable)
- Green waste: including but not limited to leaves, grass brush, garden and lawn cuttings, wood chips, tree limbs and/or tree stumps or logs
- Junked vehicles
- Rubber tires of any kind (may take as a recyclable)
- Large dead animals
- Septic tanks pumping
- Liquid wastes
- Explosives
- Pesticides
- Hot ashes
- Sealed containers larger than 10 gallons capacity that has not had the ends removed or have not been shredded
- Radioactive materials such as special nuclear or byproduct material as defined by the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 and all subsequent amendments
- Lead acid batteries (may be taken as recyclable)
- Untreated, regulated medical waste and/or infectious waste
- Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, stoves, etc
- Electronic equipment (computers, monitors, televisions, VCR's etc) (may be taken as recyclable)
- Recyclable materials
- Fluorescent lighting and all ballasts (may be taken as recyclable)
- Any container which held hazardous waste which is not considered empty according to 6 NYCRR Part 371.1 (f)
- Any unapproved commercial or industrial waste

IN HAMILTON COUNTY

HERE'S HOW WE MAKE IT WORK

ALL RECYCLABLES ARE TO BE SEPARATED FROM HOUSEHOLD WASTE WHEN THEY ENTER THE TRANSFER STATIONS



CARDBOARD

All cardboard that is corrugated, clean and broken down.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Soiled cardboard such as pizza boxes, non-corrugated cardboard



TIN CANS

All metal or aluminum. They must be empty and rinsed out.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Aerosol cans or motor oil cans or paper oil cans with metal tops



GLASS

All colored and clear glass bottles and jars. They must be empty and rinsed out.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Windows or vehicle glass.



BULK METAL

All metal that isn't under tin cans classification.



PLASTICS

- #1 (PETE) clear containers
- #2 (HDPE) colored containers
- #2 OPAQUE—milk jugs, ect.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Container tops, Styrofoam containers, motor oil bottles, clothes hangers, plastic bags, toys



PAPER

Office/mixed paper, books, phone books, newspaper, magazines, catalogs, bulk mail, non-corrugated cardboard like beer & soda cartons.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Paper with any metal or plastic attached, corrugated cardboard, soiled paper.



TIRES

All rubber tires, rubber tracks.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Tires still attached to rims. All rims must be removed and put in the metal container.



ELECTRONICS

TVs, computer peripherals including cables, cords, monitors, towers, keyboards & mice. Small electronic equipment such as VCR's, portable music players, DVD players, cable or satellite receivers & video game consoles.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Mercury thermometers, coffee makers, light bulbs.



LIGHTS

Fluorescent light bulbs (intact), Christmas tree lights.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Incandescent light bulbs, broken fluorescent light



USED OIL

If adequate space is available.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Antifreeze, gasoline, fuel oil, Parts cleaner, etc.

➤Starting January 1, 2014 household garbage must be put in CLEAR plastic bags. Household garbage in non-clear bags or containers will not be allowed in the transfer stations.

➤Although not necessary, it is recommended that all bottles and cans that have a New York State deposit be separated out of other recyclables.

➤Recyclable materials are to be separated from other waste before being placed out for pickup or being brought into the transfer stations.

ACCEPTED RECYCLABLE ITEMS FOR PICK-UP

- Plastic containers - #1's & #2's and #2 Opaque's/Clear and Colored (items must be clean and separated by number and color)
- Tin containers – tops can be included (items must be clean)
- Paper - newspaper. Magazines, office/mixed paper & phone books (non soiled)
- Cardboard – any cardboard that is corrugated (must be non soiled and broken down)
- Glass containers – clear and colored (must be clean)

Return refundable deposit items or donate them to American Legion

Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners require a permit in the amount of \$20.00. These can be obtained in the Town Clerk's Office.

All recyclables must be clean and separated for curb side pick-up. If not clean and separated it WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. NO EXCEPTIONS.

#10 Commercial cans may be crushed. All other items are garbage.

CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS ARE MANDATORY FOR YOUR GARBAGE.

ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE ASK THE TRANSFER STATION ATTENDENT OR THE GARBAGE/RECYCLABLE CONTRACTOR.

Due to D.E.C.'s burn ban – municipal burning is no longer permitted. Homeowners will be responsible for removal and burning of brush, limbs etc....
