



Indian Lake Transfer Station Recycling Rules

Open: Thursday through Monday from 8AM to 4:30PM

Closed: Tuesday and Wednesday; Thanksgiving and Christmas Day

Please Note: A Town of Indian Lake Solid Waste Permit is required to deposit trash and recyclables at the Transfer Station. The Permit can be obtained at the Transfer Station. You must provide documentation of landownership or residency in the Town Indian Lake to obtain a permit.

NEW CHANGES REGARDING SORTING RECYCABLES effective 11/1/2022

Recyclables accepted include:

- All Plastic Containers - 1 and #7 including caps; all items must be clean.
- Tin Containers & Mixed Paper can be COMINGLED – tops may be included; tin must be clean. Paper – newspaper, magazines, office, mixed paper, phonebooks. All must be non-soiled.
- Cardboard – must be corrugated, broken down clean and separated.
- Glass Containers – may be clear and colored; must be clean and separated.

Additionally:

- ✓ Items with a deposit refund may be donated to the American Legion.
- ✓ Refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners require a permit and fee of \$20. The permit can be obtained at the Transfer Station with documentation of landownership or residency in the Town of Indian Lake.
- ✓ Clear plastic bags are mandatory for garbage.

Burning: Due to the Department of Environmental Conservation's (DEC) Burn Ban, municipal burning is no longer permitted. Homeowners are responsible for removal of trees, brush, etc. Burning permits may be obtained from the DEC building located on Big Brook Road. Call 518-648-5616 for more information.

Prohibited Waste

The following is **NOT** accepted as GARBAGE at the Transfer Station:

- Hazardous waste of any kind as identified in 6 NYCRR Part 360 1.5 (b)

[Parts 360-366 and 369, Solid Waste Management - NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation](#)

- Waste Oils: Including but not limited to transmission fluid, dielectric fluid, or oil tank residues (may take as recyclables).
- Green Waste: Including but not limited to brush, stumps, tree limbs, or logs.
- Large dead animals
- Septic tank pumping
- Liquid waste
- Explosives
- Pesticides
- Hot ashes
- Sealed containers larger than 10 gallons capacity that has not had the ends removed or has been shredded.
- Radioactive materials such as special nuclear or byproduct material defined by the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 and all subsequent amendments. [Atomic Energy Act of 1954 \(AEA\) in U.S.C..docx](#)
- Any container which held hazardous waste which is not considered empty according to 6 NYCRR Part 371.1(f) [6 NYCRR Part 374-4 Express Terms - NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation](#)
- Any unapproved commercial or industrial waste
